ANZSOG and ANU E-Press monograph series

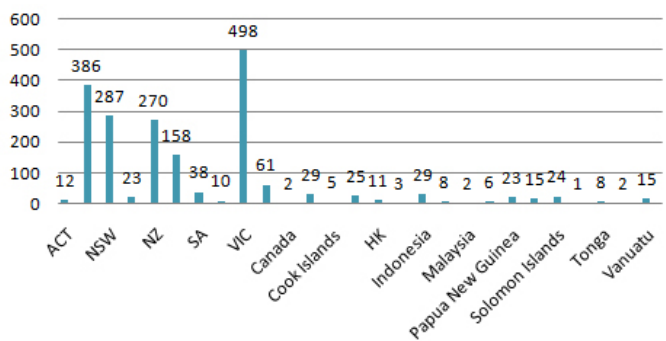
Edited by Professor John Wanna, this series covers a wide range of topics from practical and theoretical perspectives. Contributors are drawn from academia, government and the private sector.

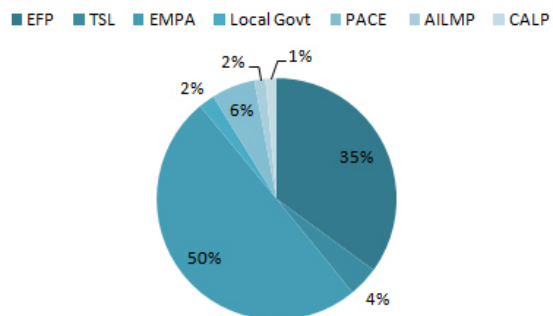
ANZSOG's Alumni Program
