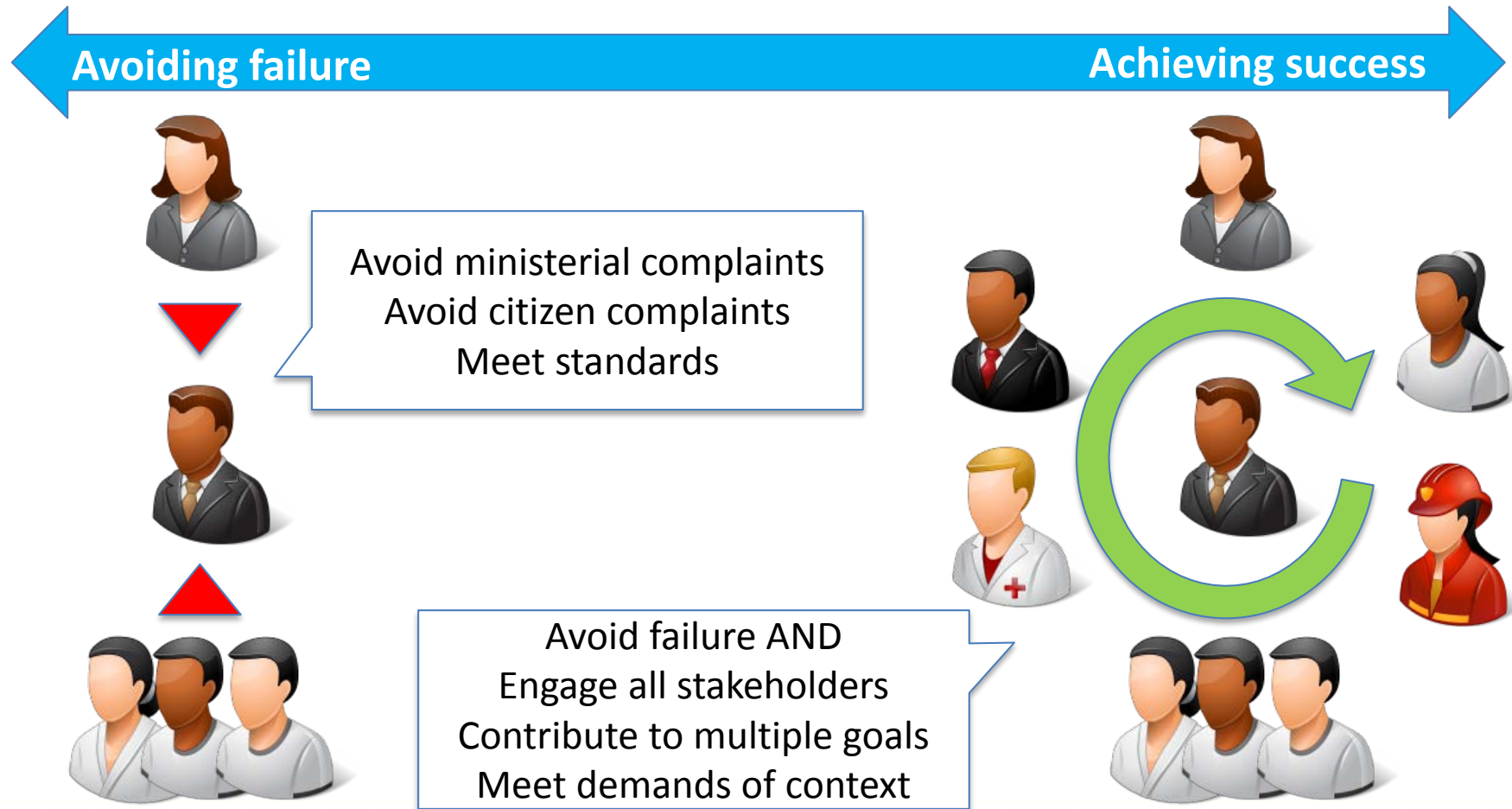

Beliefs



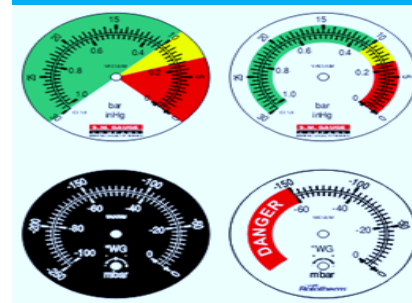
Boundaries

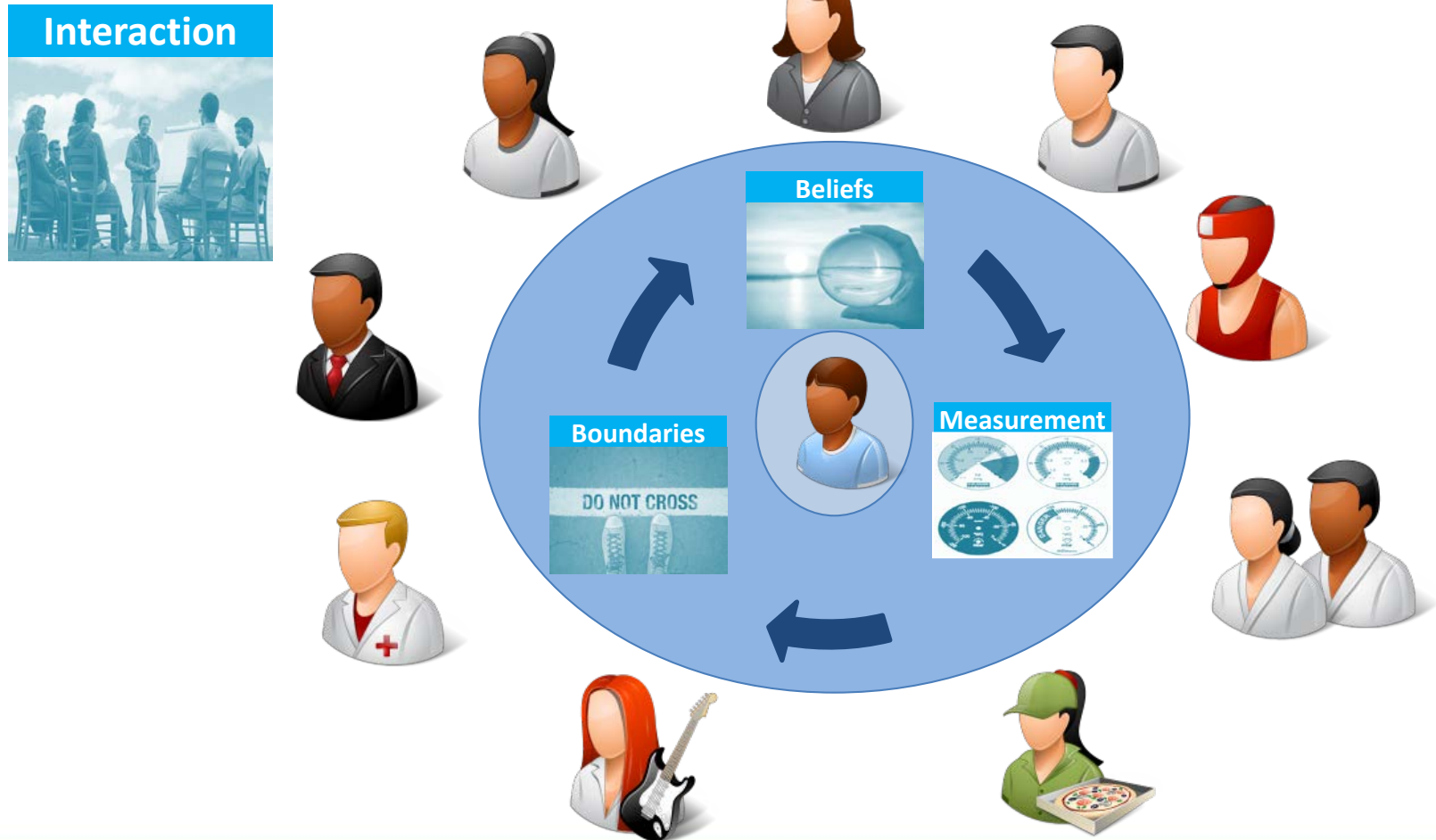
