

# China Reciprocal Program

Program dates: September 2019

**A two-week intensive in-country program for Australian and New Zealand senior public officials**

ANZSOG's China Reciprocal Program (CRP) provides an opportunity for Australia and New Zealand senior executives at the deputy head of agency level or above, to gain a deeper understanding of China, meet senior Chinese officials and explore the information, ideas, values and beliefs of the Chinese system of government. Participants visit several cities in China, demonstrating degrees of development and diversity and learning about Chinese politics, the economy, and key contemporary issues such as the environment, industry and social policy.



## Benefits:

- Enhanced appreciation of opportunities for Australia and New Zealand in working with China
- Improved confidence in dealing with Chinese counterparts in their fields of work,
- Knowledge and awareness of the cultural, economic and diplomatic challenges facing China,
- Opportunity to learn alongside public sector peers and participate in counterpart exchanges in China, and
- Membership of an esteemed alumni network of former CRP participants across Australian and New Zealand governments.

## Features:

- Multi-city program including Beijing and Shanghai as well as a minimum of two additional cities
- Visits and meetings with high level Communist Party officials at Zhongnanhai, the central headquarters for the Communist Party of China and the State Council of China.
- Lectures from leading experts on China and senior political leaders on key contemporary issues such as the environment, industry and social policy
- High level access to sites of key business innovators and state owned enterprises

- Professor Allan Fels AO, founding Dean of ANZSOG and former chairman of the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission.

Adjunct Faculty:

- Professor Kerry Brown, Professor of Chinese Politics, Kings College London and Director, Lau China Institute.
- Dr Jamie Greenbaum, ANU historian specialising in Ming dynasty cultural history and resident in Beijing since 2004.
- Specialised guest lectures from senior officials of the Chinese government and other industry leaders based in China.

## Partners and contributors:

CRP was initiated by the Organisation Department of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of China in conjunction with ANZSOG.

The Organisation Department occupies a unique role in the hierarchy of the Chinese government – it oversees appointments of all key positions within the administration.

CRP – the first and only initiative of its kind undertaken by the Chinese Government – has emerged as a natural extension of the inbound Chinese Advanced Leadership Program, run since 2011.

## China Reciprocal Program (continued)



### Cost:

AUD\$18,500 + 10% GST + return flights to China.

This fee incorporates the following:

- Expert leadership, specialised lectures from international experts on China and senior officials of government;
- Cost of all accommodation, land transport, domestic air travel in China and most meals in China;
- Canberra orientation program.
